The Maryland Independent College and University Association (MICUA) is a member-driven organization, which exists to advance the interests of independent higher education in

Maryland. Consistent with its mission, MICUA administers collaborative efforts, resource sharing, and information exchange to support campus leaders and promote access, affordability, and accountability.

A distinctive and diverse group of private, nonprofit colleges and universities constitutes MICUA's membership. These institutions offer a broad spectrum of educational opportunities, deliver quality academic programs in all regions of the State, and provide unique academic experiences not available at any public institution in Maryland.

Serving a Public Purpose

Sellinger Program

For 230 years, Maryland has provided support to independent, nonprofit colleges and universities. In 1973, the State adopted the Sellinger Program "to preserve and strengthen" a dual system of higher education, thereby saving tax dollars.

Today, the MICUA member institutions serve more than 63,000 students annually and award about 30% of all degrees conferred by a Maryland four-year institution. State taxpayers pay \$36,000 per degree conferred by a public university and \$4,000 per degree conferred by an independent college or university.

More than 85% of Sellinger funds are used to provide financial aid to students who reside in Maryland. The balance is used for State higher education goals.

Student Financial Aid



MICUA colleges and universities provide close to 18,000 grants to Maryland students every year.

Scholarship programs have many goals, but the most important are:

- Access;
- Choice; and
- Opportunity.

These programs are available to all students, regardless of race, ethnicity, or income.

The vast majority of need-based financial aid to undergraduate students is provided by MICUA institutions. Only 25% comes from public sources.

Minority Enrollment

The fastest growing population at MICUA member institutions is minority students.

Hispanic enrollment more than doubled between 2000 and 2010.

African-American enrollment grew twice as fast as the general population.

Today, 29% of undergraduate students at MICUA member colleges and universities are students of color.

Half of the MICUA institutions have eliminated the graduation gap between historically underrepresented students and the general population.



Sellinger = Success

Teachers



MICUA colleges and universities:

- Produce 35% of all teacher candidates in Maryland;
- Offer teacher education programs in underserved areas of the State; and
- Work with 140 professional development schools to meet the demand for qualified teachers.

More than 1,900 MICUA alumni teach in the State's schools, and 170 work in school district administration.

McDaniel graduate Michelle Shearer was named the 2011 National Teacher of the Year. Notre Dame graduate Joshua Parker won the statewide title of Maryland Teacher of the Year.

Nurses

MICUA institutions produce 43% of all BS in nursing degrees in Maryland.

A variety of nursing degree options are available, including:

- Accelerated programs;
- Courses at Regional Higher Education Centers and community colleges;
- Specialized graduate programs for a wide range of specialties; and
- Online degree programs.

In 2010-2011, new nursing programs were approved at Hood College, Notre Dame of Maryland University, Sojourner-Douglass College, Stevenson University, and Washington Adventist University.

STEM



MICUA institutions confer a high proportion of science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM) degrees in Maryland, producing:

- 20% of bachelor's degrees;
- 51% of master's degrees; and
- 39% of doctoral degrees.

As reported by the National Science Foundation, three of the top 50 per capita producers of PhDs in science and engineering nationwide are MICUA institutions:

- Johns Hopkins University (#20);
- Washington College (#24); and
- St. John's College (#46).

In 2010, Capitol College launched Maryland's first doctor of science degree in information assurance.

Sellinger = Qualified Workforce

Revitalization

Maryland's independent institutions are actively engaged in revitalizing local neighborhoods.

Examples of revitalization:

- Johns Hopkins University is involved in the revitalization of East Baltimore;
- Loyola University Maryland is making positive contributions to the York Road corridor;
- Maryland Institute College of Art is transforming the Station North Arts and Entertainment district; and
- Sojourner-Douglass College is renovating former public schools in downtown Baltimore.



Sellinger = Improving Neighborhoods

Community Service



Civic engagement and social awareness are part of the learning environment at MICUA colleges and universities.

It is estimated that students from MICUA institutions volunteered more than 300,000 hours with community organizations during 2009-2010.

The President's Higher Education Community Service Honor Roll is the highest federal recognition a college can receive for its commitment to volunteering, service learning, and civic engagement. The 2010 honorees include:

- Loyola University Maryland; and
- Maryland Institute College of Art.

Sustainability

MICUA colleges and universities are actively participating in Governor Martin O'Malley's Smart, Green & Growing initiative and are investing in environmental sustainability.

Examples of these efforts include:

- Goucher College earned an A- on the national sustainability report card (one of just two in Maryland);
- Mount St. Mary's 100-acre solar farm will provide renewable energy to the University System of Maryland as well as their own campus; and
- Four MICUA institutions—Goucher College, McDaniel College, Mount St. Mary's University, and Washington College—have signed the American College and University Presidents' Climate Commitment.

Economic Impact



In fiscal 2010, it is estimated that MICUA institutions directly and indirectly accounted for almost 64,000 full-time equivalent jobs and \$6.4 billion in economic output in the State.

Every year, MICUA institutions:

- Employ close to 34,000 people (excluding student workers);
- Attract about 596,000 visitors, including 179,000 from out of state;
- Spend about \$651 million on purchases of goods and services (other than construction) from companies located in Maryland; and
- Invest \$2.4 billion in research and development.

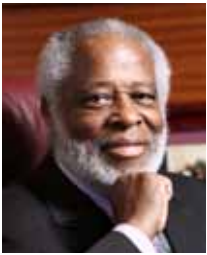
