Overview

Protecting our nation’s most critical assets from hazards—both internal and external, natural and man-made—make the national security field a vital focus for the future.

In a world where attacks come from a variety of sources, internal security has become a paramount focus of national security. Cyber security is one area posing complex challenges for the world today. Cyberspace touches practically everything and everyone. It underpins almost every facet of modern society and provides critical support for the U.S. economy, civil infrastructure, public safety, and national security. Information technology has transformed the global economy and connected people in ways never imagined.

Responding to the needs of the national security industry, the Independent College Fund of Maryland (the I-Fund) helps develop a workforce prepared to handle the many aspects of protecting businesses, today and in the future, through its National Security Scholars Program (NSSP). The I-Fund links students interested in serving their country with defense industry giants through the NSSP. The program provides a unique opportunity for scholars to explore a future in the field of national security and offers a road map to potential employment in the public and private sectors upon graduation.

Candidate Eligibility

- Must be a U.S. citizen at time of application
- Must be a full-time undergraduate attending an I-Fund member college or university
- Must be majoring in or have defined interest in one of the preferred majors or related fields
- Must be a sophomore or junior with a minimum of 24 credit hours (application must be submitted no later than October deadline of the applicant’s junior year)
- Must have a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0
- Must submit 300-500 word essay along with letters of recommendation and transcripts
- Must be available for in-person interview on two days in early November
- Must successfully complete security clearance process by May 31
- Must be able to serve summer internship following clearance process

TIMELINE

September-October

- Campus presentations
- Open application process

October-November

- Close application process
- NSSP Board meets **mid-October** for initial screening of applications to identify candidates invited to interview
- In-person interviews over two days in **early November** to include selection of semi-finalists

December-May

- Program semi-finalists notified, are prescreened via phone by NSA representative
- Successful candidates directed to complete and submit long form by **December** date
- Security clearance process ongoing with clearance approval **deadline of May 31**
- Intern sponsors prioritize intern candidates for placement
- Internship matches assigned by **mid-May**

June-August

- Scholarship award notification made by **early June**
- Internships served
- Annual NSSP **dinner in June** for NSSP Scholars and Program Partners
- Website and collateral materials updated
